BOTANIC NAME

Eucalyptus sideroxylon rosea

DESCRIPTION

Widespread in southeastern Australia, this species is noted for its, deeply furrowed, dark brown to almost black bark. The drooping narrow leaves are greyish green on both sides and the showy flowers are produced in hanging clusters of 7 through winter and early spring. They come in various shades of reddish pink and are an important source of honey.

- Fits with the general environment of the street and suburb.
